statutory or constitutional with respect to the institutions of higher education as compared to the secondary schools and the reason, primary reason that comes to mind is the research and all that it carries with it.

MRS. BOTHE: I am a little quizzical as to whether the Committee isn't sacrificing what was a beautiful theory to which I subscribed wholeheartedly to a practice which has turned out to be very effective in the state. The Miscellaneous Provisions Committee, in its report this morning and the sections which we didn't have occasion to discuss make certain, or draws certain conclusions about the present means of selection of the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Education and because that system was apparently working so smoothly, our Committee felt it was unwise to upset the apple cart by placing those offices in the Constitution or in any other respect providing for change. I don't know that the principles there would
