instance, the Patuxent Institution, where I serve on the Advisor's Board. In that instance the chief executive is selected by the Board which in turn is nominated for terms of five years by the Governor. This has functioned exceedingly well. The same person has been the chief executive there since the inception of the institution. For the most part, the same persons have served on the board. I am wondering what kind of chaos is going to result in any number of state agencies if these provisions are literally written into the

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Martineau.

MR. MARTINEAU: My question goes to the, to Dr. Jenkins. As I read this, if you take the School Superintendent would be appointed pursuant to law, which means the law could provide he could be appointed by the Governor and I just wonder what the purpose is in doing what you are suggesting.

DR. JENKINS: Well, I think the purpose is very obvious. If the Constitution says he must be appointed by the Governor then the Legislature could
