your figures were given on the assumption there was a State Board of Education in each case. I don't know this is true.

MR. POWER: In this survey, I can't answer that question, Mr. Martineau. We are having the rest of the material prepared.

DR. BARD: May I ask a question on the figures?

THE CHAIRMAN: All right.

DR. BARD: As for those four cases where the Superintendent is appointed by the Governor, I would like two answers. First what are the four states, and secondly, is there a Board over the Superintendent in those four cases. Mr. Martineau's question was in regard to other cases. In these four cases.

MR. POWER: Let me answer your first questions. I will have to look for the answer to the second. The four states are Alaska, New Jersey, Tennessee, and Virginia. I will look for the answer to the other question, Dr. Bard.
