6 and I don't think that the fears that the educators
7 often express is more than they may feel, that they
8 won't have the same rapport with the Governor. I don't
9 think that is a real fear that will develop.

10 MRS. BOTHE: Can I ask a question? I
11 wondered how many other states, if any, gave the chief
12 executive such complete and absolute powers over the
13 executive department.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, you are talking about
15 the state superintendent.

16 MRS. BOTHE: No, I am speaking generally
17 of the proposal.

18 THE CHAIRMAN: I ask you to defer that
19 until later because the motion now is only with
20 respect to the state superintendent. Any further discussion
21 on this motion?
