impartial Governor where he sees people in the educational 1 field wish they could move ahead farther than they can 2 under the existing system. There is no reason why 3 the Governor couldn't take the bull by the horns and 4 do more by this type of system than under the existing 5 and I don't think that the fears that the educators 6 often express is more than they may feel, that they 7 won't have the same rapport with the Governor. I don't 8 think that is a real fear that will develop. 9 MRS. BOTHE: Can I ask a question? I 10 wondered how many other states, if any, gave the chief 11 executive such complete and absolute powers over the 12 executive department. 13 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, you are talking about 14 the state superintendent. 15 MRS. BOTHE: No, I am speaking generally 16 of the proposal. 17 I ask you to defer that THE CHAIRMAN: 18 until later because the motion now is only with 19 respect to the state superintendent.
