the like. Now entirely without reference to the current campaign, and I want to make that clear, it is very conceivable that we could at some time have in Maryland a Governor who, through his appointee, would enter this very undesirable element into the School System. The second summary statement is that on this issue there is among a large proportion of the citizens of the state and I would say almost unanimously among educators, the deepest and strongest feeling and I would appeal to the members of this Board who do not have strong feelings on the other side not to vote for this as Mrs. Bothe says simply for the consistency of having all officers report to the Governor.

THE CHAIRMA. The question arises on the motion to amend paragraph (b) by inserting at the end of the first sentence after the words higher education the words and the State Superintendent Schools and to amend paragraph (c) by inserting in the second line after the word education the words the State Superintendent of Schools. The effect is to leave the appointment of the State Superintendent of Schools to
