MR. BOND: No, sir.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second to the motion to amend?

DR. BURDETTE: I second.

MR. GENTRY: For many of the same reasons that were advanced before, particularly with regard to some of the boards that have been specifically mentioned. I have in mind the Board of Regents of the University of Maryland. I feel that it is well not to have a complete domination of these boards by any particular Governor but have rather their terms set by the Legislature and in some cases the Legislature could provide that the terms could be for a two-year period or four-year period, half the membership of the board rotate, could be whatever is determined but there are and has been brought out here, there are certain boards which should not be subject to domination of
