been quite adequately stated. This is a prime requirement in our opinion if strong executive leadership is to be furnished in Maryland. I am sorry that we have not been able to answer Mrs. Bothe's questions relative to the practical effect. A major constitutional revision of this kind, cannot in my judgment ever be forecast with accuracy. We can only say that all the modern students of government that we have been able to check have recommended that whatever the practical effect is it will be a good one. I would hope that the Commission would see fit to adopt and pass the motion that has been presented.

THE CHAIRMAN: Ready for the question?

The question arises on the motion to approve and adopt
Section 12 as amended in Subsections (a) and (b).

All in favor of the motion, please signify by a show
of hands, (a) and (c). Before you take the vote, I
omitted Dr. Burdette in stating the changes to mention
the change in (b) that Professor Power said would have
to be made merely to conform to (c).
