of redistricting and it would not meet with the consensus 1 of opinion of a number of voters, as such, what recourse 2 would they have to upset the redistricting plan? Would 3 that have to stay in effect until the next General Assembly? 4 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard? 5 I think so. Didn't we pass some reso-DR. BARD: 6 lution in respect to petitioning, in regard to reapportion-7 ment or districting? 8 9 MR. BROOKS: Yes. DR. BARD: I think the answer is yes. 10 THE CHAIRMAN: It's not subject to referendum 11 under other action of the Commission. Any further comment 12 or question as to Section 5? Mr. Scanlan. 13 MR. SCANLAN: I think the Chair's suggestion 14 about including the word, congressional, when you use the 15 word, districting, that you use the word, legislative ap-16 portionment is a good one and I think we need to do it in 17 18 two places --I believe Dr. Winslow pointed out 19 MR. BROOKS: in the last Meeting that you have both districting and ap-20 portionment in regard to just the Legislature. 21
