

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

2 MR. MILLER: I have already expressed my views  
3 on this, on what I think is important. There is one thing  
4 that has developed since we talked about it before. We've  
5 already got a provision now in the event of death and  
6 certain situations and so on, the Legislature will call  
7 itself together.

8 I fail to see, when the Governor calls a special  
9 session, why they have to go through the formality of re-  
10 organizing or if there is an emergency, I think these words  
11 merely mean that the machinery having been set up at the  
12 start of the session, they will continue unless it's changed,  
13 which the Legislature can do, each House can change any-  
14 thing, but when they are called together or if there is  
15 a special emergency, the machinery is already in operation.  
16 The committees are appointed. There is no need of having  
17 a reorganization which, at the present time, they usually  
18 start off by just approving everything they have done be-  
19 fore, and where could it hurt anything? Where could it  
20 possibly hurt anything to give them that power?
