

1 THE CHAIRMAN: That's correct.

2 MR. MILLER: I was not going to speak. I wanted  
3 to answer a question. As a Member of the Committee, the  
4 Chair asked what we thought about the relative Report.  
5 Speaking only for myself, the main principle I want to see  
6 adopted, if we can do it, is the right of the Legislature  
7 of its own initiative to have a session, whether it's special  
8 or general and, from that point of view, this second proposi-  
9 tion, which would not involve any extra work for anybody,  
10 if we could just have it in here that the Legislature was  
11 its own boss to the extent that if three-fifths of the Mem-  
12 bers of each House wanted to have a session, they could have  
13 it, I would be satisfied about this other, although I do  
14 think this is a better way.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Mr. Hoff?

16 MR. HOFF: Mr. Chairman, according to my notes,  
17 and I may be wrong, at our July 18th Meeting, in consideration  
18 of the Fourth Report of the Committee on Legislative Depart-  
19 ment, we defeated the continuous session proposition by a  
20 vote of 16 to 9.
