minutes. There was another proposition, Senator Hoff,
which was passed by a vote of 16 to 9, which followed that,
and that was that the Legislative session should be 70
days, but the precise point here on the continuing session
was a separate vote. There were two matters both connected
with this Section and both closely tied together.

MR. HOFF: I would suggest, knowing how some of the absent Members feel about this proposition, and I know how I feel about it, and Judge Adkins, this question is bound to come up again when there is a larger representation of the Committee present; I'm just wondering, by passage of this proposition today, if we are not imposing on some of our other Committees a terrific burden of rewriting that will simply have to be undone again at a later date when this proposition is voted on.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further debate? Before Dr.

Bard proposes, I would like to state my position. First,
on the matter of substance, I would agree that logic would
support the position of the Committee and initially I was
one of those voting to approve the principle of the continuing Legislature. However, I think this is one of those
