should continue its organizational existence for two years.

A two-year term for the legislature would permit the initial organization of the two houses to carry over to the second

session. This would eliminate the need to organize the second session when it convenes and would permit the second session to commence its work promptly at the point where the first session left off.

I might add here that this particular recommendation was tied in to Recommendation 4, which would need to be written in, the one dealing with staggered terms. If you turn your page, we have recommended on another occasion that, One-half of the members of the legislature should be elected each two years. This would ensure a continuity of experience that would facilitate careful consideration of measures. Another major benefit, made vivid by the recent primary, as was clear when the ballot was so long that in some districts there was something like 80 names.

You would only have then one-half of those
running for the House of Delegates coming up every two years
and --
