1 would, therefore, expire with the election of his successor 2 and you would have a gap. 3 MR. MILLER: I would suggest, Mr. Chairman, that 4 that can be corrected, and it is a good point, by inserting 5 the third Wednesday of the January following. 6 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, I think the desirable thing 7 would be to tie it in with the other Section and I would 8 rather not try to do that right now, because I'm not sure 9 we'd get it right. 10 DR.
