THE CHAIRMAN: Yes. This is not a reconsideration, because at the last meeting of the Commission further action on this question was deferred pending the preparation of the memorandum dealing with the question. DR. BARD: We believe that this rewording will take care of both the caution that the Commission had given and at the same time our feeling that the Legislature should have adequate subpoena powers and here is the rewording: Each house shall be the final judge of the qualifications and election of its members, as prescribed by the Constitution and the laws of the State. Each house shall appoint its own officers and determine its rules of procedure, which may permit its committees to meet between sittings of the General Assembly. Each house may exercise its power to com pel the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production of records and papers either before such house as a whole or before any committee thereof, provided that the General Assembly shall have by law -- and this is the part that you asked us to insert -- protected rights of witnesses, and their records and papers.

Now, I will read the last portion, but this last
