

1 DR. BARD: The Committee has not so provided be-
2 cause we believe that in this respect there ought to be a
3 reconsideration of that feeling. There was no vote, but a
4 feeling, and we went back and considered your feelings and
5 stated it thus.

6 Now, if you believe that this extraordinary vote
7 ought to be included, I might add here that our own Committee
8 was divided with reference to whether we would go along
9 with an extraordinary vote.

10 JUDGE ADKINS: May I make a motion?

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Just a second.

12 MR. MILLER: I'd like to clear a point. What we
13 were talking about was not the right to subpoena. I think
14 it was conceded, but it was a question of punishing for
15 contempt, that it would require an extraordinary vote and
16 we decided to leave that to law.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: I would like to state my recollec-
18 tion of the discussion and the action or lack of action, be-
19 cause I think there was only one definitive action.

20 There was considerable discussion over the ques-
21 tion of whether, in the absence of any provision at all,
