DR. BARD: The Committee has not so provided be-1 cause we believe that in this respect there ought to be a 2 reconsideration of that feeling. There was no vote, but a .3 feeling, and we went back and considered your feelings and 4 stated it thus. 5 Now, if you believe that this extraordinary vote 6 ought to be included, I might add here that our own Committee 7 was divided with reference to whether we would go along 8 with an extraordinary vote. 9 May I make a motion? JUDGE ADKINS: 10 THE CHAIRMAN: Just a second. 11 MR. MILLER: I'd like to clear a point. What we 12 were talking about was not the right to subpoena. I think 13 it was conceded, but it was a question of punishing for 14 contempt, that it would require an extraordinary vote and 15 we decided to leave that to law. 16 THE CHAIRMAN: I would like to state my recollec 17 tion of the discussion and the action or lack of action, be 18 cause I think there was only one definitive action. 19 There was considerable discussion over the ques-20
