

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Is that the understanding of the
2 seconder, also?

3 MR. BOTHE: Yes.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Scanlan?

5 MR. SCANLAN: I have a question.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Let him speak as to his motion
7 first.

8 JUDGE ADKINS: I don't care to labor what I
9 consider to be the logic of the situation, because my own
10 recollection is it was debated pretty much at the last
11 hearing. I do feel that if this power extends such power,
12 frankly, I don't believe the memorandum says that, I think
13 there should be a limitation on the inherent power. I
14 think this is different from the investigations carried on
15 by the Houses in Congress and I think it could be an ex-
16 ceedingly dangerous power. It has not, to my limited
17 knowledge, been exercised in Maryland, but I think the
18 Legislature has on the whole been able to get such informa-
19 tion as it needed to this point. I don't think it need be
20 used except under extreme conditions, as I proposed.
