extraordinary vote, but it seems to me to be awfully cumber 1 some to require an extraordinary vote to even give them 2 the power to issue the subpoena. 3 May I answer that? JUDGE ADKINS: 4 THE CHAIRMAN: It's a question, yes. Go ahead. 5 JUDGE ADKINS: I don't understand that there 6 would be anything inherently illegal in any Committee 7 Chairman writing to John Jones and saying, We request that 8 you appear and testify; that you certainly would not have 9 to have a two-thirds vote on that. 10 MR. MILLER: Yes, but if you are working for X 11 12

Company and they don't want to have anything said about it and you are requested to come, the answer is, We will deny the request. If you are subpoenaed, you have an excuse to go, unless you want to exercise some special right and then you can write back and say, I refuse to come and then you would have this procedure, but otherwise, you oughtn't to tie it up.

JUDGE ADKINS: To me, the power of subpoena is
the power to enforce attendance. If that is not the
meaning of the word, I would agree with Congressman Miller.

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
