force, subpoena doesn't mean much. 2 THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Bothe? 3 MRS BOTHE: My recollection is similar to that 4 of Judge Adkins, as to the action in the September, I believe 5 Meeting, in which I distinctly recall, and perhaps incor-6 rectly, that a vote was taken by the Commission upon a . 7 motion similar to that which Judge Adkins just made and was 8 accepted by a majority of the Commission. I think this is 9 10 a question of reconsideration.

But I don't agree, unless it carries the connotation of the

12 MR. SAYRE: It's a matter of accepting new

13 language, as I understand it.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: I have no way to establish by the

15 record, unless we read the transcript. We'll try to do

16 that. My recollection is there was no vote on this ques
