6 MR. DELLA: Mr. Chairman, I think we're arguing
7 about something that to some degree is insignificant, al-
8 though it has some importance. The Legislature itself
9 generally, when they want to have a hearing on any measure,
10 whether it's a measure pertaining to one of the State
11 Departments or a general measure, whatever it may be, if
12 they feel they need witnesses to testify, they generally
13 send a request to those people who may be vitally involved
14 and ask them to come down. If they come down, that's good,
15 but if they don't come down, the Legislature passes what
16 they feel in their view is beneficial legislation. I don't
17 think they have any problem, in my 16 years fooling around
18 with the Legislature, in getting people to come down, be-
19 cause the people only come down in their own personal in-
20 terests or the interests of the people or company they repre-
21 sent.
