2 THE CHAIRMAN: I would suggest to you that the  
3 power in the Constitution that you just read is not the un-  
4 limited power that the Commission is advocating. This is  
5 limited to an investigation with reference to expenditures  
6 by the State Government and not general investigative  
7 matters. So that the only power that exists in the present  
8 Constitution which gives broad investigative powers is the  
9 grand inquest. Mr. Scanlan?

10 MR. SCANLAN: I have another question of Judge  
11 Adkins about his motion, and that's what concerns me.  
12 We're talking about language, but I don't know what the  
13 language is exactly and where it fits in here. My question  
14 is does your motion tend to mean that if the Senate wants  
15 to authorize one of its Committees to compel testimony, the  
16 Senate by an extraordinary majority must do so, or the  
17 whole General Assembly must do so?

18 JUDGE ADKINS: The Senate must do so.

19 MR. SCANLAN: I wish we had the precise language  
20 and I wish we had where it would appear in the Section. I  
21 think I could respond or agree with it somewhat more
