requested. As we pointed out several times, there are a 1 lot of witnesses that don't want to go and talk about their 2 friends. If they just say, Well, he's volunteered, but a 3 subpoena would get nine out of ten people in there. 4 it's the prosecution for contempt. On the Federal level, 5 there isn't any argument about a subpoena, that before a 6 person can be prosecuted, it requires a majority vote of 7 the House or Senate, as the case may be, and it seems to 8 me that's what we're driving at. 9 We're not trying to hamper them. We want to 10 protect people and, if they think they have a good reason, 11 they refuse and then it requires a vote of the body to 12 institute punishment or a contempt decision. 13 THE CHAIRMAN: Judge Adkins, do you want to 14 make any change in your language? 15 JUDGE ADKINS: Well, I recognize the problem, but

being the author of only the concluding paragraph, I'm a little at a loss to know what to do about it. I would suggest you refer that to the Committee adopting it.
