action shall be taken by a two-thirds vote of the House exercising such power.

All those in favor signify by a show of hands.

Contrary? The motion is carried, 11 to five.

Now, Judge Adkins, you have another motion on the same subject.

JUDGE ADKINS: I have one more and I'll quit.

I would propose a new sentence be added immediately preceding the last sentence of the paragraph and following the Amendment which we have just made which reads as follows: The right of all persons to fair and just treatment in the course of Legislative and Executive investigations shall not be infringed.

MR. BOND: I second it.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any discussion? Mrs. Freedlander?

MRS. FREEDLANDER: Do we not already have such protection in the Declaration of Rights, as adopted?

THE CHAIRMAN: I would answer, if you have a provision in the Constitution in this paragraph conferring an express power, you would avoid -- to compel attendance
