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As I understand it, and if there is any dissent, I would like to have it made known, in order for there to

4 be action to compel the attendance of a witness before 5 either House or a Committee, two things are requisite. 6

First, there must be a general law protecting the rights 7 of witnesses appearing before such a Committee. Secondly. 8 there must be a resolution compelling the attendance of 9 that particular witness before that particular Committee 10 passed by a two-thirds vote. Mr. Bond?

11 Mr. Chairman, I think I do disagree MR. BOND: 12 when you use the phrase, Such a Committee. I think the 13 general law would apply to all Committees of each House. 14 THE CHAIRMAN: I mean that.

MR. MILLER: Does the Chair think that these

words absolutely mean nothing, providing the General Assembly 17 shall have by law protective rights? 18 THE CHAIRMAN: I think they mean a great deal. 19 That's my point.
