have those words in, if I sense --

THE CHAIRMAN: I'm not expressing any opinion at the moment. All I'm anxious to do is to make sure that the intention of the Commission is expressed in words, and I am saying that as this is now amended and read, in order to compel the attendance of witnesses before Legislative Committees, two things are necessary, one, the Legislature must have passed and the Governor signed a law providing for the protection of all witnesses generally appearing before the Legislature or Legislative Committees. If that has been done, then you must have a two-thirds vote to compel John Jones to appear before a particular Committee.
