

1 Each House shall keep a public journal of its proceedings  
2 and cause the same to be published. No bill shall become a  
3 law unless it be passed in each House by a majority of the  
4 Members of that House.

5 I want to call your attention to the fact that  
6 in our memorandum, and this is the last point that we'd like  
7 to call to your attention, we still believe, and I'm not  
8 sure we're ready to set forth a proposal, but we still be-  
9 lieve that we ought to call before the attention of the  
10 Convention certainly the fact that the vote for passage of  
11 the bill or resolution should be by a majority of those  
12 present, which is the current practice in Congress, and not  
13 a Constitutional majority.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: That would mean a reconsideration  
15 of the previous Section.

16 DR. BARD: I'm not ready to so move, not at this  
17 time, no. In addition to that, the change that we were  
18 asked to make is the last sentence in Section 15, On all  
19 final actions, the yea and nay votes shall be recorded in  
20 the Journal of each House. This was really a procedural  
21 change.
