2 to this Constitution,^{or} the Laws of the State.

3 There is no counterpart in the present Judiciary
4 Article, is there?

5 THE MARTINEAU: We are voting this November on
6 the establishment of a Commission on Judicial disabilities,
7 which would give the Legislature the power to remove and
8 the last section of it says, This Section is alternative and
9 cumulative, provided in Article III of this Constitution,
10 which I gather is impeachment.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: My question is, there is no pro-
12 vision in the Article IV proposed by this Commission that is
13 a counterpart of Section 4 of Article IV of the present
14 Constitution, specifically providing for impeachment of
15 Judges.

16 MR. MARTINEAU: That's correct.

17 MR. SYKES: Mr. Chairman, I would call to your
18 attention that Section 13 of the Judiciary Article on re-
19 moval of Judges simply provided for a power in the Supreme
20 Court to remove any Judge from office, and this new -- it
21 doesn't state any relation that that power has to any other
