with the word, final, is misplaced. It's in here. I make 1 no motions. I'm not unhappy with it. 2 THE CHAIRMAN: What I was saying was in the ab-3 sence of objection, we would delete the word. Do you ob-4 ject to deleting it? 5 MR. SYKES: If it is understood definitely that 6 there is no intention of a change and that this would carry 7 over whatever the meaning of the present Constitional pro-8 vision is, I have no strong feeling on it. 9 DR. BARD: Final is not in the present. 10 DR. BURDETTE: It almost seems to me it would 11 12 be better not to use the word, final. THE CHAIRMAN: That was my point. 13 DR. BURDETTE: It implies that there could be a 14 preliminary one. We had a case in Montgomery County in 15 which the Courts, in dealing with eligibility --16 THE CHAIRMAN: Then the word, final, is deleted. 17

Now, Dr. rard, you had another matter.
