13 THE CHAIRMAN: That was my point.

14 DR. BURDETTE: It implies that there could be a
15 preliminary one. We had a case in Montgomery County in
16 which the Courts, in dealing with eligibility --

17 THE CHAIRMAN: Then the word, final, is deleted.
