and the phrase used by the Committee residual power. In other words, that the counties will have, broadly speaking, all executive and legislative but not judicial power, except to the extent that it is taken away from them by sexpressed law of the General Assembly. The same meeting decided tentatively on authorizing what we call, for lack of a better term, regional government, some government larger than a county and smaller than the State. But that was not discussed very fully, and the exact extent to which the Committee and the Commission want to go on that is a matter yet to be determined. It cannot be further deferred. The Committee has a draft and several alternate drafts, as a matter of fact, but the decision of this question must be made at this meeting because if it is deferred any longer, the necessary drafting just can't be done.

I anticipate that those special orders of business will take the rest of the afternoon and the evening session. I would hope that we would conclude those by the evening session. This leaves us still for consideration a very substantial amount of material. There is
