3 but there are one or two very substantial policy matters  
4 that need not take long, but must be discussed and de-  
5 cided. The Sixth Report of the Committee on Miscellaneous  
6 Provisions, this is not the one dealing with the educa-  
7 tional provisions but other provisions, and then the  
8 further Report of the Committee on Legislative Department  
9 with respect to impeachment. Each of you should have  
10 this morning two memoranda, research memo by W. E. Sim-  
11 mons, and a separate memo, research memo by Mrs. Freed-  
12 lander dealing with the question of impeachment. If you  
13 will look at those, I think you will conclude that there  
14 is no inherent power of impeachment in the Legislature  
15 or at least it is very dangerous to assume there is,  
16 and this means we will have to make a decision as to who  
17 shall have the power of impeachment and to what officers  
18 it shall extend. We then have a Ninth Report of the  
19 Committee on Declaration of Rights and Elective Franchise  
20 dealing with a Preamble and a redraft, revised draft of  
21 the bill proposed for the 1967 session of the Legislature,
