another Report of the Committee on the Judiciary Depart-For the most part this is merely corrections, but there are one or two very substantial policy matters that need not take long, but must be discussed and de-The Sixth Report of the Committee on Miscellaneous Provisions, this is not the one dealing with the educational provisions but other provisions, and then the further Report of the Committee on Legislative Department with respect to impeachment. Each of you should have this morning two memoranda, research memo by W. E. Simmons, and a separate memo, research memo by Mrs. Freedlander dealing with the question of impeachment. If you will look at those, I think you will conclude that there is no inherent power of impeachment in the Legislature or at least it is very dangerous to assume there is, and this means we will have to make a decision as to who shall have the power of impeachment and to what officers it shall extend. We then have a Ninth Report of the Committee on Declaration of Rights and Elective Franchise dealing with a Preamble and a redraft, revised draft of the bill proposed for the 1967 session of the Legislature,
