the people has plenary power to impose taxes and therefore, it is not necessary to make a specific grant of
the taxing power as it is in the Federal Constitution,
for example, to the Legislature because it there rests,
and this is clear.

Now, what this Section should do is to make it perfectly clear that the Legislature cannot delegate that very important power to some board or agency or anybody other than the elected representatives of the people.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes?

MR. SYKES: My question is, does the language do that? It permits a tax to be imposed by the elected representatives of the people which you say means the elected legislative representatives, although I think maybe the word, Legislature, would clarify it, but if the Legislature passes a law which says that a tax may be imposed by a Board of County Commissioners or by some administrative board which may not be directly elected by the people, the argument could be made from this language that the legislative representatives of the
