2 MR. SYKES: But while they are Executive,
3 they are also Legislative.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Case, did you want to
5 comment on the suggested language?

6 MR. CASE: I don't think that the word, Legis-
7 lative, ought to go in for the reasons that have been
8 suggested perhaps by the Chairman and primarily because
9 as I understand the words that are used in constitutional
10 context, it is not necessary. The elected representatives
11 of the people means the legislative body. That is what
12 it does mean, but as far as directly by, those are your
13 real suggestion, isn't it, Mel?

14 MR. SYKES: Yes.

15 MR. CASE: Directed by. I would like to think
16 about it a little, but right off the bat, it doesn't
17 strike me as being --
