it has been done in our County, so that, which gives you In other words, quite obviously getting another reason. back to this point of like people being treated similarly in similar situations, the tax rate has got to be the same. Due process would require this unless there are sound legislative reasons for making it different. Now, in Baltimore County for a number of years, people in the metropolitan districts paid a larger rate of tax than those in the rural parts of the County because the law permitted the County Commissioners to impose a tax within the district to help service the water and sewer lines. This is perfectly all right, because people in the metropolitan district get a great deal more for their money than people living out in the rural areas. here was a perfect example of where you did have, indeed.
