

1 And that a sentence be added in substance to say, without
2 limiting the power of the Legislature to classify on
3 other grounds, the classification of real property may
4 be based on agricultural use thereof as provided by law,
5 or some such formulation.

6 MR. CASE: No.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there a second?

8 MR. CASE: Let me merely say -- no second?

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Apparently not.

10 MR. CASE: The Committee rewrote this language
11 at least four times, trying to come up with something
12 that would be proper and acceptable and not, you know,
13 that it couldn't be better a fifth time. But this is
14 really a tough little technical problem here, just how
15 to get this worded property, and I can say that this was
16 the best judgment we could come up with. Now, we did not,
17 I will say tha, we did not consider the Chairman's
18 suggestion that perhaps to broaden this constitutional
19 provision to deal with open spaces such other than agri-
20 cultural because I think we felt, at least I feel this
21 way, and I would hope the Committee Members would
