

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further comment?

2 MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, I think it might
3 be well to move that, and I make this in the form of a
4 motion so that if Dr. Burdette or anyone else feels on
5 any ground that they would rather oppose, they will have
6 a chance to do so.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Rather what? I didn't catch
8 your words.

9 MR. CLAGETT: I was suggesting we present
10 this in the form of a motion in that anyone who might
11 want to oppose it on the ground stated by Dr. Burdette
12 or any other ground, would have a chance to do so on his
13 vote.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: What is your motion?

15 MR. CLAGETT: That the recommendation of the
16 Committee that there be no such prohibition as presently
17 contained in the Constitution be approved, be adopted.

18 MR. GENTRY: I second it.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Ready
