DR. BURDETTE: No.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Burdette, do you want to be recorded as No?

DR. BURDETTE: Yes.

THE CHAIRMAN: Anyone else want to have their vote recorded by name?

JUDGE WALSH: I want to have mine recorded as being opposed. I don't know what the motion was. I am voting against the authority to give the Legislature the authority.

THE CHAIRMAN: Then your vote will be against the authority. Any further discussion? Move on to the next one.

MR. CASE: The next two things are really -I think can be handled quite shortly or quite briefly.
On Page 29 you will find a rather long provision of the
