problem.

THE CHAIRMAN: Could I ask you just to comment further on one aspect of the problem with respect to the Attorney General? At the session with the members of the Liaison Committee of the Legislature, some members of that Committee suggested that if the Attorney General were appointed, that perhaps the Legislature should have its own counsel and I know your Committee considered that. I wondered if you couldn't comment on that generally.

JUDGE ADKINS: We have considered it. We have not attempted to take a definitive standpoint on the matter since we think that is properly a question within the purview of Committee on the Legislature. If this Commission should adopt our recommendation that the Attorney General's office be no longer a Constitutional office, it might then very well be that the Legislature would desire to have independent counsel, but we did not think that that was within the purview of our Committee to act on that question.
