Mr. Scanlan closes debate, I would like to state very 1 briefly my own reasons for opposing the motion for 2 constitutional autonomy for the University of Maryland 3 without repeating the reasons given at the last meeting. 4 I have tried, as I indicated, to draft what I thought 5 could be acceptable to those sharing my views as/division, 6 providing in the Constitution for some recognition in 7 the Constitution for the University of Maryland, and what 8 I have done is highlight the distinction of what I 9 thought should be in the Constitution and that of the 10 opponents of the Section 3. It seems to me that the 11 University ought to have as broad autonomy as possible 12 in all academic matters. It should have general super-13 vision of the institution. I don't think in this respect 14 it differs one bit from that of any other institution 15 of higher education. I think the same principle is 16 applicable. At the same time, I feel that the Legislature 17 ought to have the ultimate control in determining how 18 far the governing boards of the University and the other 19 institutions may go in controlling expenditures, in 20 setting tuition fees and in determining all the other 21
