Civil Rights speakers spoke at the compus, and a resolu-1 tion was introduced and not passed. Generally, the 2 additional Members of the Legislature will come from 3 the suburban areas of the State, which traditionally have 4 been very solicitous and very considerate and understand-5 ing of the needs of the University of Maryland and the 6 other institutions of higher learning in this State. I 7 think there is even less reason to fear undue legislative 8 interference with the operations of the University of 9 Maryland than there may have been in the past, and in the 10 past, as Mrs. Bothe has put it, the University has 11 12 flourished.
