

1 Civil Rights speakers spoke at the campus, and a resolu-  
2 tion was introduced and not passed. Generally, the  
3 additional Members of the Legislature will come from  
4 the suburban areas of the State, which traditionally have  
5 been very solicitous and very considerate and understand-  
6 ing of the needs of the University of Maryland and the  
7 other institutions of higher learning in this State. I  
8 think there is even less reason to fear undue legislative  
9 interference with the operations of the University of  
10 Maryland than there may have been in the past, and in the  
11 past, as Mrs. Bothe has put it, the University has  
12 flourished.
