three prior Governors, or one present and two prior Governors. There was something of a split insofar as the Attorney General was concerned. My recollection of the testimony -- I haven't checked this but I think I am right -- my recollection of the testimony was to the effect that Governor McKeldin felt the Attorney General should be elected and the other two, Governor Tawes and Governor hane were not as strong in their views as to the election of the Attorney General as was McKeldin. Governor Lane, did I accurately state your views?

GOVERNOR LANE: They are correct. There
was one question I would like to raise. Do we preserve
in the election of the Governor and the Lieutenant
Governor a partisan ticket?

JUDGE ADKINS: In our recommendation, yes, sir. That will be involved in the fourth report, but to answer your specific inquiry we are recommending that they run jointly, so that just as the president and vice president now do, so that you would not have the possibility of a Lieutenant Governor of one party.
