2 I therefore feel very strongly that the position  
3 which we have just taken makes it even more imperative  
4 than ever that we free the State colleges and other  
5 public institutions of higher education to the same degree.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Jenkins?

7 DR. JENKINS: Mr. Chairman, I wish to empha-  
8 size and support the statement just made by Dr. Bard that  
9 all of the reasons for providing this freedom for the  
10 University of Maryland apply also to the other institu-  
11 tions of higher education. I may say as sort of a ex  
12 post facto statement that my vote for the original  
13 statement was not with regard to the University of Mary-  
14 land based on the assumption that the General Assembly  
15 group controls the purse strings and will ultimately have  
16 control of higher education in the State.
