Constitution, the same cannot be said of the other institutions which have, and particularly the Board of State Colleges, has only an existence of a few years, very few years, and has had no experience with management of its own funds, per se. I would urge that you vote against the motion.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre?

MR. SAYRE: I have two questions; the first one is in interpreting higher education, does that include colleges?

DR. BARD: I think we ought to add the word, State public institutions. I think that is a good concept.

MR. SAYRE: Then it would not include -DR. BARD: Would not include the junior col-

MR. SAYRE: So the junior colleges could move into a State position if the Legislature made it.

DR. BARD: That is possible. The junior colleges are local institutions. The question is an important one, far more important than it may seem. As
