2 deal more autonomy than I do as executive consultant  
3 at Bowie State College. It is possible for us within the  
4 frame of reference of our local units to, if we have a  
5 necessity for filling a position, if money is available,  
6 we can do this under the autonomy that is given to us  
7 under the City Charter, for example. But there is no  
8 such possibility under the present structure that is  
9 in existence as far as the State colleges are concerned.

10 I personally find no need, and I think I would  
11 say the same for other junior college presidents, to  
12 extend this to include local higher educational institu-  
13 tions.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Do I understand you want to  
15 change your motion to strike the word, public, and make  
16 it State?

17 DR. BARD: No, I would put, State, before  
18 public; and all other State.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Use both words?

20 DR. BARD: I thought that might take care of  
21 his objection to, local public.
