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THE CHAIRMAN: I understand. But you would want both words?

DR. BARD: Well, it might otherwise mean State private institutions, and you don't need that really. I guess, Mr. Chairman, I think you have convinced me that you really don't need both. State will do.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Bothe?

MRS. BOTHE: That is agreeable with me.

MR. SAYRE: My other question simply relates to the meaning of this additional provision. As I interpret the meaning, it is merely putting into the Constitution a guideline that is non-enforcing, actually, isn't it? I mean, this is what the Legislature already can and would so, isn't that right, to the statute, and I just don't see where --

DR. BARD: I would like to get back to the point the Chairman made. Placing this in the Constitution sets forth a direction. As you will recognize, this comes from Mr. Ency's structure. It sets forth a direction and not just a perfunctory guideline. It makes it clear that this is where we stand in regard to
