

1 council has only advisory powers. But we at the Univer-  
2 sity respect this advisory council, and I might say that  
3 when major undertakings are afoot such as the institution  
4 of a new college which was done when the College of  
5 Architecture was installed in the curriculum last year  
6 that before this was done, the whole matter was submitted  
7 to the advisory council for their judgment and determina-  
8 tion. So I don't think it accentuates a two-headed  
9 monster in any sense of the word. Now, as to my feeling  
10 perhaps as a Member of this Commission, and maybe more  
11 perhaps as a Member of the University's Board, there is  
12 just no question about the fact that if we are to have  
13 a fine system of higher education in this State, the  
14 University cannot do it all.

15 Those people who thought the University was  
16 then end-all, be-all of higher education in the State  
17 have come to realize that this cannot and should not  
18 be the case, because the job is just too big. There are  
19 too many people to be taken into one institution, and in  
20 my own judgment, the University today is at its optimum  
21 size. I would hate to see it get much bigger with upwards
