of 30,000 students at the College Park campus, University of Maryland Baltimore campus expected to go to 5,000 within a relatively near future term, and with the professional schools in Baltimore adding several thousand more to that, you can see what the University is going to be.

Now, it is therefore not only desirable, but almost acutely necessary that the State colleges be given every chance to grow and strengthen. This is good for the University of Maryland, and it is good for the State in the largest sphere. I feel, therefore, that this amendment which Dr. Bard has suggested deserves the worthy consideration of the Commission because I feel that it will, it does take a good long step down the road of strengthening the State colleges which, as I see it in the future will probably be the colleges closer to the people than any other institution of higher learning. Therefore, I hope that the Commission will sustain this motion.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

MR. MILLER: Parliamentary query, Mr. Chairman.
